Sub: Immediate credit of Government revenues received through Cheques/ Drafts and encashment of Bills/Cheques in March, 2017.

Madam /Sir,

I am directed to say that Government dues received in the month of March are required to be credited to the Government Account by the end of the financial year. Normally, it takes a few days for clearing of State Government dues received through Cheques / Drafts. It is expected that there will be heavy transactions on 30th and 31st March, 2017. As such, it is to be ensured that all Government revenue receipts through Cheques /Drafts are expeditiously cleared and brought into Government Account by the end of the current financial year.

- 2. Further, it is noticed in the past that a number of Bills/Cheques which were passed by the Treasuries / Sub-Treasuries in the late hours of 30th/31st March and sent to the respective Banks for payment could not be encashed as their computerized system did not admit the last minute transactions.
- 3. The Reserve Bank of India have issued instructions that all agency banks shall keep the counters of their designated branches conducting government business open for Government transactions up to 6.00 P.M. on 30th March, 2017 and up to 8.00 P.M. on 31st March, 2017. All electronic transactions would continue till mid-night of 31st March, 2017. With a view to facilitate accounting of all Government transactions for the current financial year (2016-17) by 31st March, 2017, the Agency Banks have also been instructed to conduct special clearing exclusively for Government transactions (both receipts and payments) in all clearing houses with return clearing on the same day in the evening/ night of 30th/31st March, 2017. Letter No DGBA, GAD NO. 2377/42.01.029/2016-17 dated 16th March, 2017 of the General Manager, Department of Government & Bank Accounts, Reserve Bank of India, Mumbai on "Annual Closing of Government Accounts Transactions of Central/State Governments Special measures for the current financial year

(2016-17)", D.O. Letter No. DPSS.CO.CHD No./2656/03.01.03/2016-17 dated 23rd March, 2017 of Chief General Manager-in-Charge, Department of Payment and Settlement Systems, Central Office, RBI, Mumbai on "Special Clearing operations on March 30 and 31, 2017" are enclosed herewith.

4. Therefore, the Agency Banks carrying on business of the Government and the Treasuries/Sub-Treasuries as well as DDOs in your District may be instructed on the following lines to ensure timely credit of Government revenues and disbursement of claims presented in the Treasuries:

(a) Agency Banks:

- to clear all Cheques /Drafts tendered towards Government revenues on the same day and forthwith reflect the same in the scrolls submitted to the Treasuries.
- (ii) to keep the counters of their designated branches conducting government business open for Government transactions up to 6.00 P.M. on 30th March, 2017 and up to 8.00 P.M. on 31st March, 2017. All electronic transactions would continue till mid-night of 31st March, 2017.
- (iii) to ensure clearing of Government receipts and payments on 31st March, 2017 till the Treasuries transact.

(b) Drawing & Disbursing Officers:

The Drawing & Disbursing Officers are to ensure timely submission of all claims in the Treasuries so that claims can be encashed during the financial year.

(c) Treasury Officers/Sub-Treasury Officers:

As the centralized and computerized payment platform of the R.B.I and Core Banking system of the Agency Banks may not accept the last minute transactions, the Treasury/Sub-Treasury Officers are to ensure that payment advice for the claims presented in the Treasuries are issued preferably by 30th March, 2017. Payment advice for the remaining claims , if any, should be issued latest by 5.00 P.M. on 31st March,2017 so that the claims can be encashed during the financial year.

Annual Closing of Government Accounts - Transactions of Central / State Governments – Special Measures for the Current Financial Year (2016-17)

The Government of India has desired that all government transactions with banks must be accounted for within the same financial year and has requested that certain special arrangements be made for the purpose, as in previous years. Accordingly, all agency banks should keep the counters of their designated branches conducting government business open for government transactions up to 6.00 p.m. on March 30, 2017 and up to 8.00 p.m. on March 31, 2017. All electronic transactions would, however, continue till midnight on March 31, 2017. Banks may give adequate publicity to the special arrangements made.

2. As regards conduct of extended clearing sessions / operations on these two dates, separate guidelines are being issued by our Department of Payment and Settlement Systems, Central Office, Mumbai.

Special Clearing operations on March 30 and 31, 2017

A reference is invited to the circular issued by our Department of Government and Bank Accounts (<u>DGBA.GAD.No.2377/42.01.029/2016-17 dated March 16, 2017</u>) on 'Annual Closing of Government Accounts - Transactions of Central / State Governments - Special Measures for the Current Financial Year (2016-17)'.

2. With a view to facilitate accounting of all the Government transactions for the current financial year (2016-17) by March 31, 2017, it has been decided to conduct special clearing at all clearing houses across the country on March 30 and 31, 2017 as detailed below:

b. Special clearing in non-MICR/ECCS clearing houses

- 3. It is mandatory for all banks to participate in the special clearing operations on these two days. All member banks of the Clearing House are required to keep their inward clearing processing infrastructure open during the Special Clearing hours and maintain sufficient balance in their clearing settlement account to meet settlement obligations arising out of the Special Clearing. However, participation in the outward clearing is left to banks depending upon the instruments received by them towards credit-to/payment-from Government accounts.
- 4. Member banks of Clearing Houses are advised to adhere to the instructions contained in this circular as well as the instructions received from the Regional offices of Reserve Bank of India and Presidents of respective Clearing Houses. In case of image-based clearing at CTS locations, separate operating procedure will be decided for these two days and advised to all member banks by the President of the respective CTS location and in this regard member banks may be guided by the circular issued by NPCI to all member banks and President of the three grids vide their circular NPCI/2016-17/CTS/Circular No. 32 dated October 3, 2016.
- 5. Member banks are also advised to be in readiness to participate in the Centralised Payment Systems (RTGS and NEFT) on these days (March 30-31, 2017). A separate broadcast message in this regard will be issued through the respective system indicating the extended time window.
