Guideline for provision of Pre-School Education (PSE) Kit for Anganwadi Centers under ICDS for the FY 2020-2021

Introduction

The pre-school education component under ICDS Scheme is a crucial component of the packages of services envisaged under the Scheme. It aims at school readiness and development of positive attitudes towards education. Strengthening of pre-school education would also supplement the effort in achieving the national goal of universal primary education. The pre-school education in Anganwadi Centres is provided through non-formal and play way methods by joyful learning. Details of the preschool education have been circulated in the guidelines for Nua Arunima for strengthening pre-school education.

Objective

ECCE aims at the holistic development of the children. The PSE under ICDS is imparted through a play based and activity based approach. Thus the transaction of the ECCE Curriculum supported by the PSE kit containing relevant local and cultural teaching learning materials to facilitate a quality and joyful learning at the AWCs.

Process

A preschool kit is to be provided to the AWCs for usage in the centre for the preschool children coming to the AWC. The items in the kit may be multiple in terms of possible play activities and concepts, durable safe for children (non-toxic and without sharp edges), culturally and environmentally relevant, cost-effective, easy to maintain, handle and store and conducive to creativity and problem solving.

Procurement

The procurement of the materials would be effected at the level of AWW by a procurement plan through Jaanch Committee. The AWW shall procure the materials from the open market.

Funds

Necessary funds would be transferred to the DSWO Account, who, in turn, would transfer the same to the Joint account of the AWW concerned. The physical and financial progress will be intimated to the Department.

Non-negotiables

The procured materials should be safe for children (non- toxic and without sharp edges etc.) environmentally relevant, cost effective, easy to maintain which will foster holistic development in all domains.

The collection of teaching learning materials;

The good quality following materials may be arranged from the community for use at the pre-school:

- Toys bank – Dolls, indoor and outdoor toys
- Play materials – Skipping, bat, ball, blocks, music/sound systems etc.
- Libraries & teaching materials – song & story books, picture books, drawing notes, scribble slates, slates, white board, colour chalks, crayon etc.
- Activity Corners - Homemade simulative toys/play materials to be encouraged to be kept in AWCs.

Documentation and Monitoring

- On purchase of the materials the AWW shall maintain a stock account of the Pre-school kit in a register.
- The stock shall be procured annually and the monitoring officials to ensure the availability of PSE Kit during the event of Children's Day observation on 14th November as the fixed day monitoring at the AWCs.
- The monitoring officials to ensure the use of PSE kit in the AWCs during the time of visit on ANKUR day 19th of every month.

Social Audit on PSE Kit availability at the AWCs:

- PSE KIT supplied will be launched once on 19th March, 2021 in presence of children, parents and Community leaders.
- The showcasing of the Kits will be made by eminent community leaders in active participation by the community on Ankur Diwas of March, 2021.
- The Kits and individual items are to be marked/ written with indelible ink / permanent ink with year of supply and name of Anganwadi centre and the list of materials inside the Kit.

- The Mother's committee shall be involved to oversee the procurement, availability and use of PSE Kits at the AWCs. Signature of minimum 5 members of Mother's Committee is essential in the procurement receipt and register.

Revision of Guideline:

It envisaged the revision on PSE kit guideline incurred as per the new steps and initiatives for transparent and quality in services.

The following may be arranged from the community for use at the pre-school.

- Coconut Shell for water play
- Use and throw glass, cup
- Glove puppet
- Finger puppet
- Paper puppet
- Leaf puppet
- Clay material
- Cereal, pulses, seed (collage)

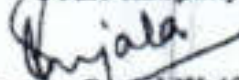
Sub: Printing and supply of New Arunima Work Books - I & II to pre-school children.

Concept Note on roll out of ECCE training in the State

Backdrop

Training and capacity building is crucial as the achievement of programme goals depend on the effectiveness of frontline workers in empowering families and communities for improved childcare practices and efficient and effective delivery of Anganwadi service. As per the guideline of GoI, the training on ECCE is to be conducted in a cascade model at three levels, First by experts (NIPCCD); second by State Level Master Trainers (SLMTs).

ECCE training Objective

1. To familiarize the participants with the concept and importance of ECCE.
2. To build an understanding of the philosophy, principles and components of the National ECCE Policy, curriculum framework and quality standards.
3. To introduce and familiarize the participants with the contextualized ECCE curriculum and roll out of the same in the AWCs.
4. To orient participants on the diversity issues and strategies to handle diversity in the classroom.
5. To develop skills of the participants to train on the execution of the Daily, weekly lesson plans based on thematic approach.
6. To orient participants on enhancing community and parents partnerships and developing linkages with the existing services.
7. To familiarize participants with the mentoring and monitoring skills to ensure implementation of the curriculum.

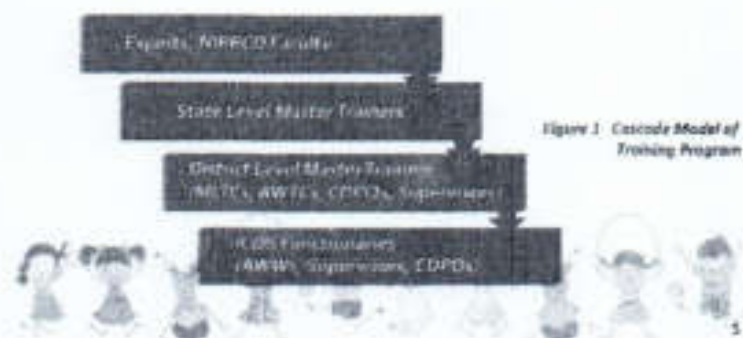
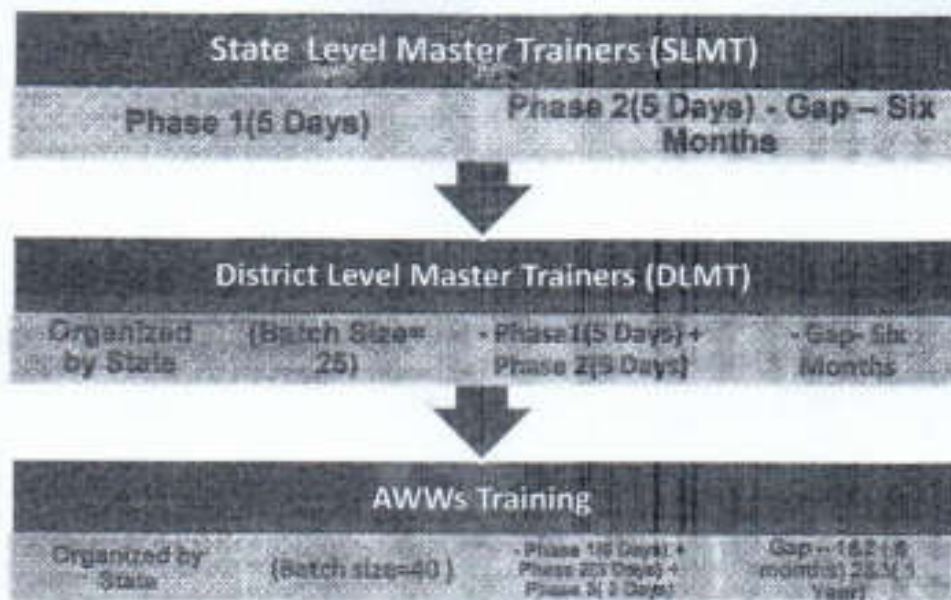


Figure 1 Cascade Model of Training Program

Expected outcome of Strengthened ECCE - ICDS;

- 3 hours of play and activity based preschool education with a developmentally appropriate ECCE curriculum for 3-6 year olds.
- The transaction of the above curriculum would be facilitated by the revised PSE Kit @ Rs 3000 and activity books for children
- Early stimulation programme for under 3s to foster their holistic development
- Early detection of delayed developmental milestones; early intervention for children with special needs
- Assessment of children to ensure that the programme is responsive to the developmental needs of the child
- Monthly fixed village ECCE day for community and parent involvement and advocacy.
- Improved infrastructure
- State ECCE policy, curriculum framework and quality standards prepared and under finalization and being pilot tested.
- New Joyful learning approaches for children 3-6 years old that are developmentally appropriate, with trained AWWs
- School readiness interventions for 5 plus year olds –in AWCs or in Schools, as per state context
- Application of Mo Bikash Patra for each individual child at the AWC.

Concept Note on roll out of ECCE training in the State

Backdrop

Training and capacity building is crucial as the achievement of programme goals depend on the effectiveness of frontline workers in empowering families and communities for improved childcare practices and efficient and effective delivery of Anganwadi service.

As per the guideline of GoI, the training on ECCE is to be conducted in a cascade model at three level, First by experts (NIPCCD); second by State Level Master Trainers (SLMTs); and at the third level by District Level Master Trainers (DLMTs). The present training module has been prepared for the training of state level master trainers at the national level by ECCE Cell, MWCD with technical support from UNICEF. The training content and schedule can be contextualized for state specific requirements by the states for second and third level trainings.

State Context on ECCE Training

Five CDPO from three RDC division was attended the training. The State Level Master Trainers SLMT trained on ECCE were; Shanta Barik, CDPO, Loisinga, Bolangir, Manju Nayak, CDPO, Bhubaneswar (Urban III) Khurda, Snigdha Rani Mishra, CDPO, Similiguda, Koraput, Ranjubalasahoo, CDPO, Banrapal, Angul, Kamini Prava Swain, CDPO, Krushnaprasad, Puri. Madhumita Das, was attended half a day orientation on ECCE from Women and Child Development Department, Government of Odisha.

ECCE training Objective

1. To familiarize the participants with the concept and importance of ECCE.
2. To build an understanding of the philosophy, principles and components of the National ECCE Policy, curriculum framework and quality standards.
3. To introduce and familiarize the participants with the contextualized ECE curriculum and roll out of the same in the AWCs.
4. To orient participants on the diversity issues and strategies to handle diversity in the classroom.
5. To develop skills of the participants to train on the execution of the daily/weekly lesson plans based on thematic approach.
6. To orient participants on enhancing community and parents partnerships and developing linkages with the existing services.
7. To familiarize participants with the mentoring and monitoring skills to ensure implementation of the curriculum.

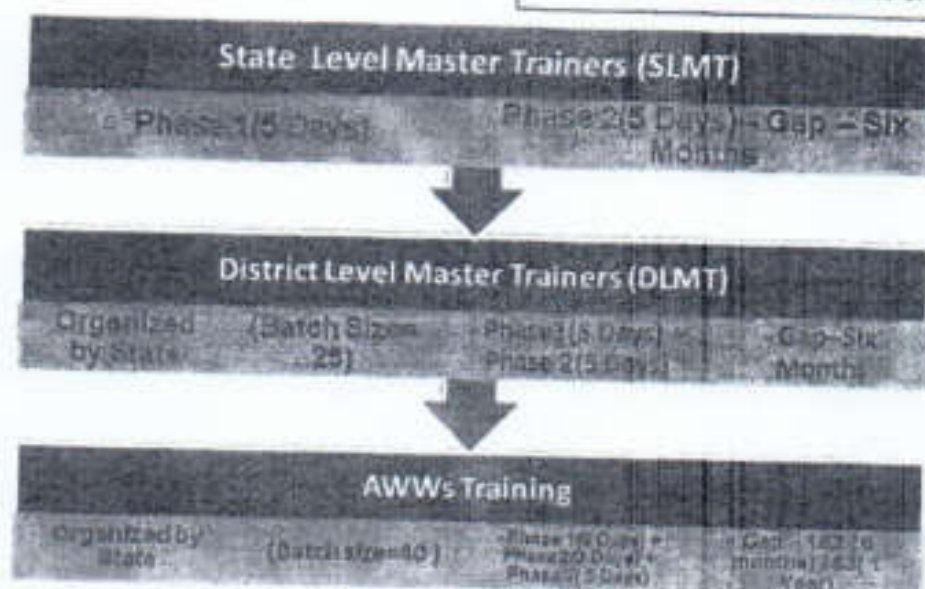
ECCE Training under ICDS

The training will be conducted in a cascade model at three levels, first by the experts, second by the State Level Master Trainers (SLMTs) and at the third level by the District Level Master Trainers (DLMTs). The State Level and District Level Master Trainers will be selected by the states in accordance with the criteria set by MWCD and NIPCCD. The experts will comprise of NIPCCD Regional Centre faculty, external experts from NGO and Academia etc. The SLMTs will comprise of experts from the states who have extensively worked in ICDS and contributed to preparation of curriculum in the states. These can be people from MLTCs, NGOs, CDPOs, ICDS Programme (District/Block level Officials) etc. The DLMTs will comprise of people from AWTCs, Supervisors etc. who have extensive experience in ICDS.

Expected outcome of Strengthened ECCE under Restructured ICDS;

- 4 hours of play and activity based non formal preschool education with a developmentally appropriate ECCE curriculum for 3-6 year olds.
- The transaction of the above curriculum would be facilitated by the revised PSE Kit @ Rs 3000 and activity books for children
- Early stimulation programme for under 3s to foster their holistic development
- Early detection of delayed developmental milestones; early intervention for children with special needs
- Assessment of children to ensure that the programme is responsive to the developmental needs of the child
- Monthly fixed village ECCE day for community and parent involvement and advocacy.
- Screening and Early Intervention and stimulation for children under 3 years
- Improved infrastructure
- State ECCE policy, curriculum framework and quality standards prepared and under finalization and being pilot tested.
- New Joyful learning approaches for children 3-6 years old that are developmentally appropriate, with trained AWWs
- Detection and referral for delayed development
- School readiness interventions for 5 plus year olds –in AWCs or in Schools, as per state context
- Monthly Fixed Village ECCE days(local toy bank, community involvement , parent to parent communication, display of activities)
- Co-location of AWCs/school where locally decided for better quality and transition

Budget

Grant-in-aid during 2015-16 for conducting Level 2 (Supervisors) Training of District Level master Trainers(DLMT) and Level 1 training of Anganwadi Workers on Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) under ICDS Scheme during 2015-16.

The sanction amount for the State by the Ministry of Finance is 2422.61. (in Lakhs)GOI share as per revised cost norms to be released to States (60% of Total cost). Total Amount released to the State i.e 25% GOI share is 363.39.(in lakhs)

1st instalment (on 60:40 basis) 302.83 and balance amount of instalment 60.56 is sanctioned to GoO to conduct the ECCE trainings. The amount has been sanctioned for the ECCE training of Supervisors and AWWs as DLMT exclusively. The approved financial norms are attached in Annexure-1 for the reference. The detail of the funds transfer for the ECCE training budget is attached in Annexure - 2 for Supervisor and Annexure-3 for AWWs, Annexure - 4 is the details of budget break up for each training and Annexed 5 is the module of District Level master Trainer.

This sanction issues with the concurrence of UFD/MWCD vide their Dy.No. ECCE-2/2015-ECCE dated 14.01.2016. Annexed 1, 2 & 3 as referred to in MWCD's letter no.8-1/2014-TR dated 12.01.2015 regarding financial norms for training on ECCE as prescribed by the MWCD.

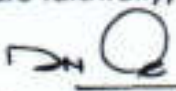

Ref: This Department letter nos 6868 dated 11.06.2020; 7112 dated 19.06.2020; 7881 dated 09.07.2020 and 8191 dated 16.07.2020

Madam/Sir,

With the reference to subject letter in reference, I am to say that, 'Ghare Ghare Arunima', a calendar based on list of fulfilled activities, is getting released every month as per the theme for the month for preschool education at Anganwadis. This is based on Revised Nua Arunima curriculum in order to ensure that the children are engaged and stimulated at home during the pandemic. This is being appreciated at various levels and cited as a best practice for allowing continuance of preschool education, albeit at home. Theme of 'Ghare Ghare Arunima' Calendar for the month of August is 'My Family' (copy enclosed).

2. We need to ensure that, the programme reaches every Anganwadi child of the age group 3-6 years in the state. During telephonic interaction by the State Monitoring Cell some parents had not been sensitised enough or the calendar not reached them. Absence of smart phones & net connectivity or pre occupation of the field functionaries may also have contributed to this gap.

3. Be that as it may, since Early Childhood Care & Education (ECCE) is an important component of ICDS scheme, the continuance of activities through song, dance, painting, storytelling, listening, numeracy etc will help dispel boredom and keep children stimulated & energised during the pandemic. However, all COVID related precautions need to be taken by the AWWs/ Supervisors/ CDPOs/ DSWOs etc.

4. In order to ensure that every child participates in the programme and that parents/ grand parents /care givers participate in the programme wholeheartedly, the following mechanisms are to be put in place,

4.1 The DSWOs are to certify by 7th of every month that, the calendar/videos etc, based on the theme of the month, have reached all AWWs. The DSWOs may have mechanism to obtain similar certificates from CDPOs.

4.2 All AWWs may be provided 3 copies of colour calendar in A3 size paper for better visualization and dissemination. Approximate cost of printing of prototypes may be upto Rs 4/- per copy and cost of printing met from available funds. Such copies may be shared with AWWs and parents, and the expenditure may be reimbursed after release of funds under the Preschool Education Kit. Requirement of printouts may, however, have to be objectively assessed and limited to households not having smart phones & net connectivity. Should there be more than one Anganwadi child in a household, only one printout may be supplied.

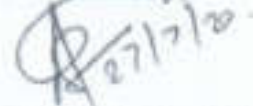
4.3 The AWWs must be adequately sensitized to remotely monitor the activities through whatsapp or through telephonic calls with the parents or some willing volunteers of the village, preferably adolescent girls. Protection of Field Level Functionaries (FLWs) such as AWWs/ AWHs is of paramount importance and they must refrain from unnecessary exposure during home visits. They must use masks/gloves and maintain basic hygiene practices such as washing hands & social distance. They must not get into any household for this purpose.

4.4 Prototype of a calendar will be shared with districts early for printing and circulation amongst all Anganwadi children.

4.5 An IT savvy personnel/consultant, in the office of the DSWO may be assigned the task of monitoring activities under Ghare Ghare Arunima and their timely reporting to the Department.

You are therefore, requested to take stock of the implementation of this program and keep me posted from time to time.
