As per the letter from the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India, a new scheme is launched **PM - Janjatiya Unnat Gram Abhiyan**. The mission will cover approximately of 63000 villages across the country under the following criteria-


1. Villages with a population of 500 or more and with at least 50% Scheduled Tribe population.
2. Villages in Aspirational Districts/Blocks with 50 or more Scheduled Tribes .

Attached herewith is a comprehensive list of tribal villages in your districts. This is to be verified through field surveys for new AWC requirement and Saksham Upgradation. For Upgradation into Saksham AWCs , prerequisite under the Guidelines must be followed.

To ensure equitable childcare and nutrition services through the AWC scheme for all tribal communities in our state, required data is to be submitted in the prescribed format by 07.10.2024. Your prompt action is essential.

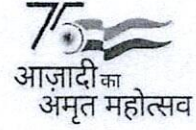

Dear Secretary,

I am pleased to inform you that the government has approved the **Pradhan Mantri Janjatiya Unnat Gram Abhiyan**, which was announced in the **Union Budget (2024-25)**. The mission aims to improve the socio-economic condition of tribal communities by adopting saturation coverage for tribal families in tribal-majority villages and Aspirational Districts. I extend my sincere thanks to you and your entire team for their valuable suggestions and ideas, which have been incorporated into the approval process of the Abhiyan.

Based on the learnings from **PM JANMAN**, the mission focuses on convergence, outreach, and saturation, with a total outlay of approximately **Rs 79,000 crore**. The implementation involves **25 interventions** carried out by **18 Ministries and Departments** as detailed in Annexure-I (Intervention/Financial Outlays).

1. Scope: The mission will cover approximately **63,000 villages** under the following criteria:

- Villages with a population of **500 or more** and with at least **50% Scheduled Tribe population**.
- Villages in **Aspirational Districts** with **50 or more Scheduled Tribes**.

The state-wise District, Block, number of village, and indicative gaps are provided in **Annexure-II**.

2. Data Validation: The Antyodaya Mission data (AM-II), collected by MoRD in 2022, has been used as a baseline to identify the existing infrastructural gaps in villages. However, as this data is **2-3 years old**, we request that the concerned sectoral Ministries/Departments work with their counterpart State agencies to *revalidate and identify the exact gaps*. This will help finalize the Mission targets and project investments.

3. Mega Event and effective action for 2024-25

A **mega event** launching the Abhiyan is proposed for the first week of **October**. It is designed on the lines of the **Hon'ble PM JANMAN events** held on **15th November '23 and January 2024**.

In the above context and to ensure the optimum and effective utilization of the **Rs 6700 crore** allotted for the current year urgent efforts are required to *disseminate information about the Abhiyan* to the State Agencies and *commence seeking project proposals, selection, and sanctions*. To expedite these actions, you are requested to undertake **collaborative workshops** with the states on the Abhiyan, design your implementation strategy, and obtain said proposals.

The aforementioned implementation strategy and sanction proposals developed with your State counterparts, will be presented by the Ministry and states, led by the Secretary GoI, at the **Janjatiya Unnat Gram National Manthan Shivir** on **27th September** in the presence of the Hon'ble Ministers and State dignitaries.

4. Some Key Actions

To ensure successful implementation, the following activities can be undertaken in collaboration with the concerned State Departments:

- **Survey and Identification of Awas Beneficiaries** of PM-AWAS for ST beneficiaries on **Awas Plus** (MoRD).
- **Identification of Gaps for Road Construction** as per the approved norms of **PMGSY** (MoRD).
- **Identification of Unelectrified Villages, Households, and Public Facilities** (Ministry of Power and MNRE).
- **Identification of Districts/tribal groups requiring Skill Development Centres/training** (MSDE).
- **Proposals for Sanction of Home Stay Projects** (Ministry of Tourism).
- **Mapping of Gaps for Sanctioning Hostels under Samagra Shiksha** (DoSEL) at the District/block level.
- **Identification of Gaps and Sanctioning of Anganwadis, WCD** (explore rentals)
- **Dovetailing schemes and beneficiary identification (FRA Pattadars)**- MoAFW, DoAH, DoF


Further, you are requested to:

1. Identify a **Nodal Officer**.
2. Take suitable timely action on **Finance-budget outlays, lines, and process**
3. Frame relevant **Scheme Implementation guidelines** urgently.

Undoubtedly, PM -Janjatiya Unnat Gram Abhiyan is one of the largest and most complex governance endeavours. As showcased in PM JANMAN, only your collaborative spirit and leadership will make this mission a resounding success for the unreached.
